





Will employers raise monthly salaries in H2 2024?

56.13% of employers **plan to increase salaries**, while 43.86% of employers don't.









What plans do employers have for additional benefits in 2024?

62.28% of employees don't plan major changes in additional benefits.









What are the employers hiring intentions for H2 2024?



Average gross salary is 2.332 EUR.




